Digitization: Current Practices to Future Prophecies

Within libraries, archives, and museums, the ability to provide content to our users in a manner that is customized to their needs has steadily increased. Technology has enabled our institutions to disseminate our holdings in ways that have been in some ways unforeseen and innovative, while others have been under realized. In this presentation, I will discuss the history and current state of digitization and also what lies over the next hill. I will draw out the rationale that the future of archival digitization lies in the combination of multiple modalities of capture, and innovation in the cultural heritage space exists at the intersection of collections imaging and conservation imaging. By combining technologies such as traditional capture, spectral imaging, 3D capture, and computer processes like computer vision and even artificial intelligence, we will be able to learn more about art works than ever possible before. These advances will enable our institutions to serve our communities in ever increasing ways and will meet the needs of our users as their demands for such technologies grow.
